KS1 Forecast

Term 2 2025-26

This term our theme is: **Nurturing Nurses**

Maths

In Year 1, the children will learn to add and subtract with number bonds up to 10. They will then move onto *Geometry*, identifying 2D and 3D shapes before finishing the term looking at money, learning to recognise the different coins and notes.

In Year 2, the children will continue to add and subtract with 2-digit and 1-digit numbers using the column method. They will then move on to multiplication and division, learning the 2, 5 & 10 times tables. They will also learn to tell the time, look at fractions of halves, quarters and thirds and finish the term looking at 2D and 3D shapes.



History

Children will learn that Florence Nightingale was another nurse who, like Mary Seacole, went to the Crimea to care for sick and injured soldiers. They will learn how Florence worked hard to educate others on the importance of keeping hospitals clean and free from infection, and that her work is still carried out today in modern hospitals. They will learn that Florence was fondly known as 'The Lady with the Lamp' by the soldiers she cared for. They will compare the similarities and differences of both nurses too.

RE

This term we will be learning about Christianity, children will learn about the Bible and begin to understand that stories in the Bible have a deeper meaning, which can impact the way Christians live. We will also look closely at churches and what and how they are used.

English

This term we will continue learning our non-fiction text 'The Terrible Troll'. We will use this to write our own information texts about a different mythical creature. We will then learn a journey story called 'Little Charlie'. We will build a description toolkit and then use the tools needed to write our own journey stories that include lots of description.

Science

This term we will continue our 'bodies and senses' unit focusing on naming the parts of the body associated with each sense covering sight, hearing, touch, taste, feel. We also look at the importance of staying healthy through hygiene, diet and exercise.

DT

In DT the children will practise their sewing skills by designing and making a Christmas bauble. They will then evaluate their finished product.
