What is Pupil Premium?

The Pupil Premium Grant (PPG) is a government scheme designed to narrow the attainment gap for disadvantaged pupils in schools in England.

What does that mean?

Did you know your child would be given a £100 virtual voucher if you are eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant? This could be spent a many things during the school year.

Extra curricular clubs

School trips

Uniform

Beavers and Brownies

Music lessons

Swimming lessons

If you are in receipt of any of the following benefits you may be eligible for the Pupil Premium Grant.

- Universal Credit (annual net income of no more than £7,400, as assessed by earnings from up to three of your most recent assessment periods)
 - Income Support, income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or income-based Employment and Support Allowance
 - Support under Part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
 - The guarantee element of Pension Credit
- Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
 - Working Tax Credit run-on (paid for four weeks after you stop qualifying)
