Skills

In reading, the children will continue to focus on developing their fluency skills to help develop comprehension skills such as retrieval and inference.

In writing, the children will continue developing the foundations of different sentence structures, including using basic punctuation and a range of conjunctions. They will also begin to apply composition techniques to show an awareness of the reader.

PSHE – Dreams and Goals

In this unit of work, the children will gain an understanding of how people reach their dreams and goals, including dealing with knock-backs. This links closely with our school value: resilience.

Geography

The children will be focusing their Geography skills on Italy by locating this on a map and the capital city. In addition, they will identify some key physical features of Italy e.g. mountain ranges and volcanoes.
