Homework: Highlight the subordinate clause in each of the sentences below:

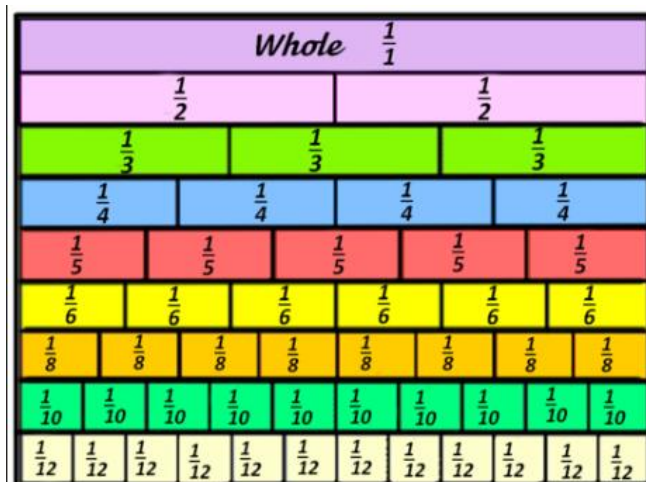
- 1) The flat burned down because the electrics hadn't been checked.

- 3) The wind danced around the trees before heading south.
- 4) Tom saw the maid when she came through the door.
- 5) While looking through the window, Sophie saw the BFG.
- 6) She felt sad whenever she saw the picture.
- 7) Grandma said I could go out to play if I finished my homework.
- 8) If you eat all your dinner, you can have an ice cream.

Extension: Write your own sentences using subordinating conjunctions.

Maths: This week we have focused on equivalent fractions. We have been using fractions walls (opposite) to help us.

Homework: Write a selection of equivalent fractions e.g.  $\frac{1}{2} = \frac{2}{4}$

Extension: Explain in your own words how you know if a fraction is equivalent – using a diagram may help.
