Skills

In reading, the children will continue to focus on developing their fluency skills to help develop comprehension skills such as retrieval and inference.

In writing, the children will continue developing the foundations of different sentence structures, including using basic punctuation and a range of conjunctions. They will also begin to apply composition techniques to show an awareness of the reader.

RE – Why is the birth of a baby in each religion important?

Children will gain an understanding about why a baby being born is special. They will make comparisons between different religions regarding the birth of a baby.

Art

The children will be using watercolours to create different shades to create a background. They will then use a different material to create a foreground of Stonehenge by creating a silhouette.

DT

The children will be creating a thumb beaker pot using the techniques of Bronze Age people. They will create a design and analyse how they can join different materials for a purpose.
